NEW BROADWAY-STATE TRANSIT SERVICE and how to use it...

Service Starts Monday, December 15, 1947

Broadway-State line is 26.84 miles long—from 119th and Morgan to Devon and Kedzie.

To provide more regularity and additional service on this long and important route, the north end of the line from the Granville "L" station to Kedzie and Devon will be provided with a new bus line on Monday, December 15.

This new bus line will assure its users of frequent, reliable service, eliminating the gaps on Devon that result from delays to streetcars operating through the congested traffic areas.

As more streamlined streetcars are delivered they will be added to the route from Clark and Devon to 119th and Morgan.

Both the streetcar and bus services will operate on a 24-hour schedule with headways fitted to the needs of riders during different hours of the day.

During the rush hours extra streetcars—so marked—will be looped back at Ardmore and Broadway to even up the service over the entire line.

Passengers riding from the North end of the Broadway-State line to downtown or south or west side points can save considerable time by transferring to the "L" at either Loyola or Granville stations, thus avoiding delays due to street traffic.

The Transit Authority is working on similar improvements on a number of other lines in all sections of the city and will inaugurate those new services as rapidly as additional equipment can be obtained.
