

### California Dreamin'

n a few short weeks, Executive Vice President Jeff Morales will be trading in this toddlin' town for Tinseltown; well, not exactly, but it's close. Jeff Morales will be heading to the west coast to be the director of the California Department of . Transportation (Caltrans).

Morales was tapped by California Governor Gray Davis to oversee a department with an annual budget of \$8.5 billion, about 22,000 employees and a multi-modal network of buses, inter-city rail, ferries, aviation and 15,000 miles of freeways.

As the new head of Caltrans, Morales will be responsible for using his expertise to carry out Governor Davis' plan to improve mass transportation in the state. "One of the things the Governor is interested in doing is having the agency become more flexible in its approaches to meeting congestion and looking more into finding alternative ways to get around the state," said Morales.

Morales joined the CTA a little more than two years ago as the Executive Vice-President of Management and Performance. Prior to coming to Chicago to help lead the CTA team, he was a senior staff member of the National Performance Review which served under Vice President Al Gore

While at the CTA, Jeff Morales has been instrumental in helping the CTA to rebuild both its infrastructure and its ridership. Among his accomplishments at the CTA, Morales helped to secure federal and state funding for capital improvement projects such as the reconstruction of the Blue Line Cermak (Douglas) Branch. One of his earliest accomplishments was developing a mission statement which

located throughout the service area. In addition to better serving the customer, the revitalized concession area program will bring significant



improvements to the physical layout of concession spaces and a substantial increase in lease revenues to the CTA. As part of the CTA's Concession Redevelopment Program headed by Art Andros, Manager of Real Estate Retail and Concessions and his staff, uniform lease terms were established to include longer lease periods as well as provisions for controlled merchandising and guidelines for improved presentation and appearance.



Previously, the terms of the concession leases were inconsistent and were primarily renewed month-to-month.

Examples of the types of new-andimproved concessions are found in 1999's pilot concession program. At Rosemont, for instance, sandwiches, soups and salads are now sold in addition to more traditional concession items in a space that was renovated to include refrigerated display cases, new fixtures, and ceramic tile flooring.

Look for construction to start late this year on some of the new concessions.


### CTA gets you there... CityPass gets you in!!

### CTA Wins an Encore Award for Make A Difference Efforts

TA makes a difference every day in the lives of customers, who make an average of 1.5 million trips a day on its buses and trains. But besides providing customers with ontime, clean, safe and friendly service, CTA employees also make a difference in their communities, where they devote countless hours to helping less fortunate neighbors and improving the communities themselves. This past April, the efforts of CTA's employees were recognized for the second year in a row by the Make A Difference Day committee, which presented the agency with one of only 10 annual awards given out to 6,000 participating groups nationwide.

More than 500 CTA employees took part in the Make A Difference Day campaign last October 23<sup>rd</sup>. They collected four tons of food, books and



clothing donated by co-workers throughout the system, and helped rid Chicago streets of six tons of garbage in partnership with the CHA, the Park District, the Public Schools and the Department of Streets and Sanitation.

Working on their own, CTA volunteers helped transport and manage over 250 students from four high schools, who painted hallways, lobbies and 36 living units at the CHA's Armour Square Apartments on Wentworth south of 31st. They also cleaned a half-mile stretch of alleys and curbs adjacent to the apartments.

Other CTA volunteers spread Halloween cheer at Cook county Hospital by decorating the play room, Intensive Care Unit and emergency room waiting areas with streamers, paper pumpkins, and spider webs. They also worked with city and County Sheriff's office volunteers to clean up vacant lots around the Wentworth Gardens Apartments, in the 3700 block of South Wells, by removing tree branches and debris.

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As Morales prepares to face the new challenges of running Caltrans, he says leaving is bittersweet. "I leave with some mixed emotions. The job isn't done yet that I came here to do. There's also the reality that when you're talking about trying to make an organization responsive, the job is never done. What I feel very good about is that we've put pieces in place that I think will carry forward the types of changes we'll be making, such as capital improvements, funding, the program manager, and a number of other steps such as modernizing our whole system of employee benefits. The future is good here for the CTA. its employees and its customers."

"It's critical to keep the momentum going. We've started a lot of great things, but the job's not done. The main thing is just to recognize how critical the CTA is to the region and the city of Chicago. It's been a phenomenal experience and there is no question in my mind that I would not have been capable of doing the California job if I had not been here. I've had a really enjoyable time being here, working with everyone and seeing all the good things that do happen here. It's a great city, a great organization and I think that good things are ahead."

"The decision to leave was personally a very tough one, because my wife and my two children have really enjoyed being here and we like Chicago. We're very settled in, we're involved in a lot of community activities and we really felt that Chicago was really home."

As Jeff Morales looks ahead to life in California he adds, "Well, I guess I'll have to learn to surf and water-ski. My children think their life is going to be nothing but swimming pools and sunshine and who knows, it very well may be. As for me, I am looking forward to seeing snow only in a postcard or on the mountain tops."



#### **#10** BUS RESUMES DAILY OPERATION MAY 27

he #10 Museum of Science and Industry bus will run daily for the summer, from Memorial Day through Labor Day. Normally it runs weekends and holidays year-round, and daily during summer and Christmas holidays. It connects North Michigan Avenue and State Street downtown with the Museum of Science and Industry. For summer, it runs every 30 minutes on weekdays and every 20 minutes on weekends and holidays.

#### **#130** GRANT PARK TREASURES BUS

he #130 Grant Park Treasures Bus returns over Mother's Day weekend again this year. The buses operate directly from the Ogilvie Transportation Center and Union Station to the lakefront museums. The buses will operate Saturdays, Sundays and holidays from Saturday May 13 through Labor Day, Monday, September 4.

The buses run every 15 minutes, with trips from the Ogilvie Center starting at 9:35 a.m. on Saturdays and 10:35 a.m. on Sundays and holidays. Return trips from the Adler Planetarium begin 30 minutes later, with the last bus leaving at 6:05 p.m.
