Snuffing Out a Fire Bomb

The prevention of fire and sabotage and the handling of magnesium fire bombs were the subjects of the day when about 100 Surface Lines foremen and assistant foremen, chiefly from Shops and Equipment Department, met at Kedzie Depot March 26.


Following the meeting, during which a sound movie on putting out incendiary bombs was shown, two of the foremen demonstrated what they had learned.

These photos, into which flames have been painted, are the result:

Such bombs are used to set and spread fires.




Careful to keep a safe distance from the fire-spitting bomb, some of which contain explosive charges, Walter shovels on sand which he has dumped from the pail.

Sand will not extinguish the bomb. But it slows its burning, prevents the fire's spread, and makes the bomb easier to handle.




John mans the extinguisher's pump while Walter squirts on a spray of water. Unless used as a spray, water makes a bomb explode and scatters its molten metal.



John takes over the task, and shovels up the still-burning bomb.

So that its molten metal won't eat through the bottom of the pail, he already has thrown in several inches of sand.



Since the pail's handle is too hot to touch, John and Walter use some ingenuity (and a shovel).

After carrying the bomb outdoors, they will let it burn itself out in safety.

Application Is Made for Minute Man Flags



AFTER employees passed the 95%-participation mark this month in buying defense savings bonds through our payroll allotment plan, application was made to the United States Treasury Department for authority for us to display the Minute Man flags which signify wholehearted cooperation.

Sponsored by SURFACE SERVICE MAGAZINE, present plans are to award a Minute Man flag to employees at each important Surface Lines location where the group is completely behind our country's war effort through the purchase of bonds. At least one flag will be presented employees in all major departments.

3800 Sign Up Last Month

Nearly 3,800 employees signed up for bonds last month, bringing the total number of Surface Lines folks who are having bond deductions made from their semimonthly paychecks to 15,028.

Numerous others not included in that total are regularly buying bonds from the Surface Lines cashier of a series or denomination not offered under the plan.

Employees now are putting more than \$67,000 monthly into defense bonds through the payroll allotment plan. Average monthly

bond deduction per employe is about \$4.50.

Besides purchases under the payroll plan, Surface Lines employes and employe organizations have bought more than \$250,000 worth of defense bonds through the Surface Lines cashier.

Most Groups Reach 100% Goal

Employees in Transportation, Engineering and Electrical Departments and in most—but not all—of the other departments already have reached their goal of 100% participation.

It is hoped that when the Minute Man flags have been purchased and delivered employees in all departments will be cooperating completely in the plan.

Triangular in shape, the Minute Man flags are three feet wide opposite their point, and five feet long. Blue in color, they bear a Minute Man, in white, surrounded by a circle of white stars.

Employees may justly take great pride in the fact that the Surface Lines is among the first large Chicago organizations whose bond-buying record was good enough to permit it to ask for authority to purchase the flags.

Lineman Wins Praise from 30 War Workers

BECAUSE HE wasn't "afraid to do a little work when officially off the job," Emergency Lineman's Helper George MacDonald, Electrical Department, earned the gratitude of about 30 war workers whom he helped to get to work on time when the street car in which they were riding one day last month was halted by a broken trolley wire.

"We were traveling east on a Grand Avenue car," wrote the war workers, who signed themselves "The Gang," "when we came to a stop.

"After five minutes' wait, we became uneasy. We didn't have too much time to spare. As the conductor came through the car, a young man asked the reason for the delay.

"The conductor said a wire was down.

"We must keep these cars moving," the young fellow said. He offered to see what could be done.

"Outside, we saw there already was quite a line-up of cars—eight, altogether.

"Approaching the first car, the young man showed his credentials to the motorman. The motorman reported he was 13 minutes late,

and that it would be 20 minutes before the repair truck arrived.

"The young man climbed to the roof of the car. He gave directions about moving the car, then removed the broken wire. Remaining up there, he passed word back to the other motormen on how to move their trolley poles.

"We were soon on our way, and much relieved. We all made the job on time.

"It says something for the caliber of your employes that they aren't afraid to work when officially off the job.

"Some of us were discussing the incident later, and thought it wouldn't be a bad idea to write and give this young man a plug."

All Mileages Increase in Keep 'Em Rolling

EXCELLENT WORK by repair crews in the Keep 'Em Rolling Contest last month brought increases in average mileages per pull-in because of equipment failures at all 16 carhouses.

Armitage, climbing from sixth to first place, showed an average mileage of 10,686—an increase of 93.6%.

Second and third place fell to 69th Street and Division, respectively, whose average mileages were 10,206 and 9,850.

9 Applications Approved by Employes Relief Committee

NINE applications for relief were received last month by the Employes Relief Committee. After investigation, all were approved for assistance.

Active cases on the relief roll at the end of the month numbered 186—four having been removed by death or other causes.

A total of \$1,663,241 has been paid out of the fund since the organization of the committee. Disbursements last month amounted to \$7,759.

In Memoriam

Thomas J. Farrell, conductor, Armitage, died March 30, following an operation. Only 32 years old, Tom, whose nickname was "Butterball," periodically served as a traffic checker in the Schedule Department and as an assistant in the Photographic Department. His hobby was photography, and many of his pictures have appeared in this magazine. Interested in any sport, he gamely rode at full gallop the first time he climbed on a horse. Surviving are his wife and son.

Michael McVady, motorman, 77th Street, died March 2, following an illness of several years. An employe for 13 years, he was 40 years old. Quiet and well liked by his co-workers, he leaves a wife.

John Terruli, Track Department, died March 8. Forty-seven years old and an employe for 11 years, he had been ill for six months. His hobby was raising flowers, and several times he entered blooms in flower shows. He leaves a wife, daughter and two sons.

James Vertelko, car cleaner, Cottage Grove, Shops and Equipment Department, died March 7, following an illness of more than two years. Fifty-one years old, he had worked for the Surface Lines 21 years. Surviving are two daughters.

Harry Scholnick, motorman, Blue Island, died March 13 of an infection which set in after he had fractured his shoulder. Quiet, unassuming, he was 56 years old and had been an employe for 20 years. Surviving are his wife, three daughters and three sons.

George Rochetsky, Track Department, died March 12 when he was found beaten and robbed in an alley back of his home. Sixty years old, he had 35 years of service. Surviving is a wife who lives in Poland.

Joseph E. Gannon, motorman, Kedzie, died March 16 of pneumonia. His illness was brief. Forty-five years old, he had worked for the Surface Lines 15 years. A vice president of the depot credit union, he took a very active part in the group's affairs. Surviving is a brother John, also of Kedzie.

Dominick Pancotto, motorman, Kedzie, died of a heart attack February 17—just two hours after becoming ill on his car. Fifty-six years old and an employe for 26 years, he had worked at Blue Island as a motorman for several years. Surviving is his wife and two sons, one of whom is a private in the army.

William Zitzow, conductor, North Avenue, died April 5, of a stomach ailment. Fifty-four years old and an employe for 20 years, he leaves no immediate survivors.

William Dobson, clerk, Elston, died April 5, following a long illness. Fifty-one years old, Bill began work as a conductor in 1914. Crippled by arthritis in 1926, he was made a clerk. Because he always lived near the depot, his entire family was known by most of the trainmen. Surviving is his daughter, mother, sister, and a brother, who is a conductor at 69th Street.

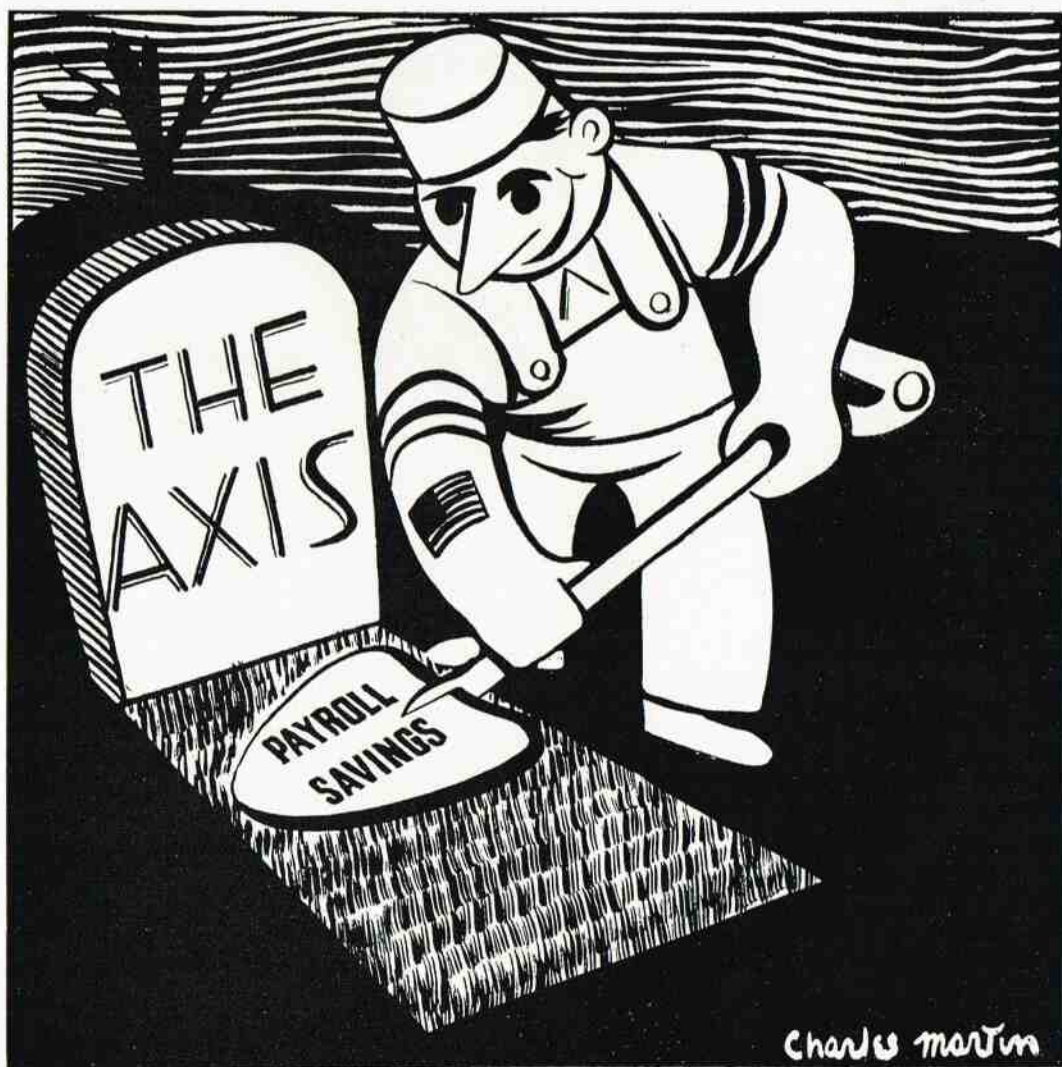
Thoroughly American

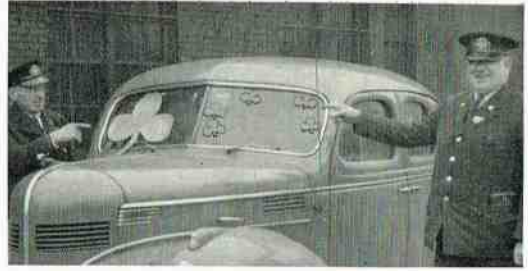
Kedzie

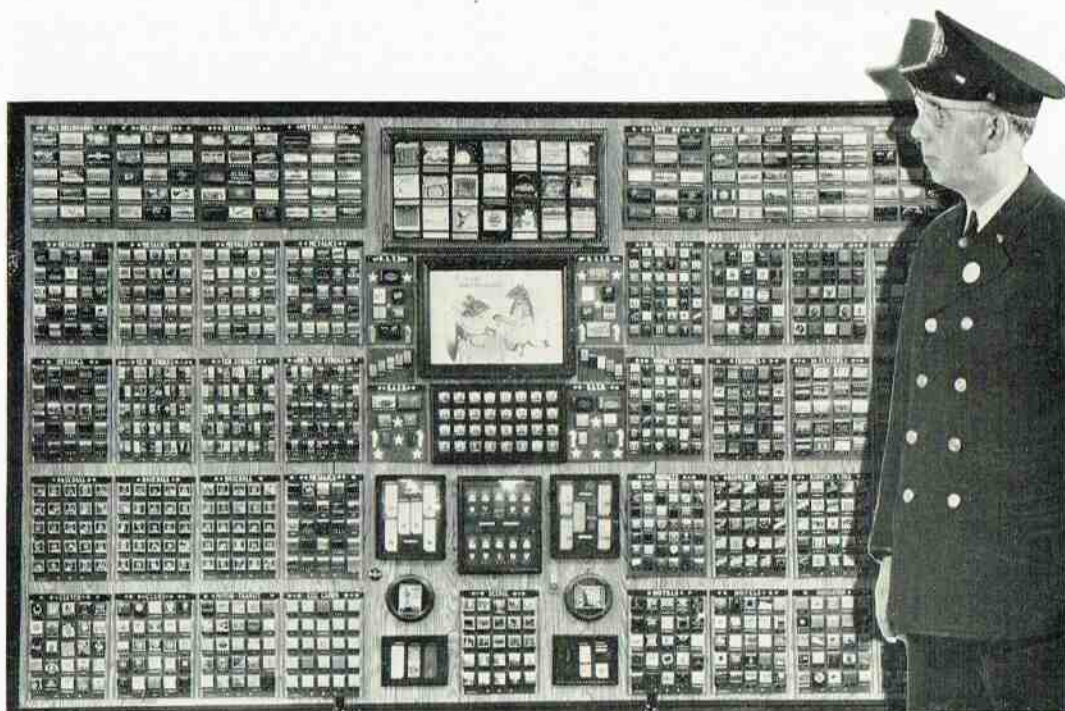

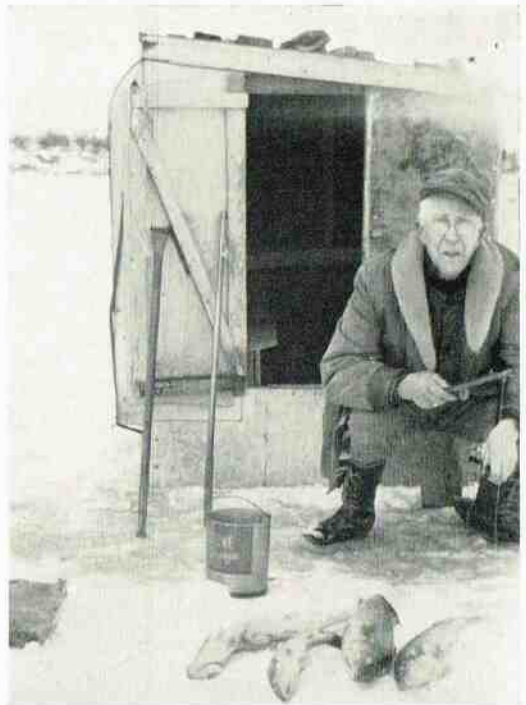

Lost-Time Accidents Show Small Increase

EMPLOYE lost-time accidents increased 1.3% in the Surface Lines during the recently-ended fiscal year. Only the Building Department employees finished the 12-month period with a clean slate.

Transportation Department, with its more than 10,500 employees, had six more lost-time accidents this year than last. In Electrical and Track Departments, such accidents increased by four and three, respectively.

Shops Employes Reduce Accidents

Repair forces in the Shops and Equipment Department cut their lost-time accidents by four, while shop workers in the same department decreased theirs by one. Records of the remaining employe groups follow: Utility Department, decrease of two; Building and Material and Supplies Departments, decreases of one; and all other departments, increase of one.

Good safety work of South Shops and car-house and repair forces in decreasing their lost-time mishaps during the year was recognized by the Greater Chicago Safety Council

5302 Trainmen Honored on Safety

More than half our 10,500 trainmen, 5,302 in all, were honored early this month for their safety-mindedness when certificates were presented them by Supervisor of Accident Prevention William Pasche for having had no chargeable accidents throughout the year.

Of this group, 227 have had none for the last 15 years—the period during which no-accident records have been kept in their present form.

Seventy of the group have had no accidents for the last 14 years; 45 for 13 years; 47 for 12 years; 26 for 11 years; 38 for 10 years; 35 for nine years; 73 for eight years; 102 for seven years; 182 for six years; 303 for five years; 443 for four years; 621 for three years; 1,030 for two years; and 2,050 for one year.

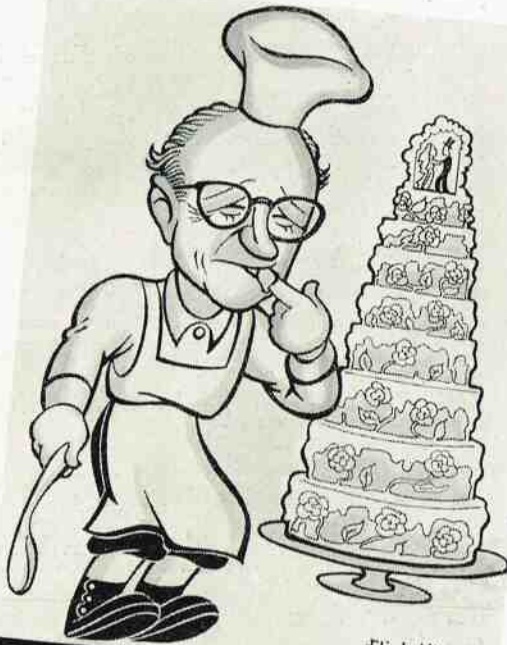
