


While Tony brushes off a few flecks of dust here, his father, Tom, also a Track man, listens to his lecture on the care and handling of a compressor.

Frank is serving with the coast guard in Georgia, and Joe with the army in New Jersey.


Others in the photo are, left to right: Stan Janasek, Foreman Ed Rooks, John Kehoe (Joe's brother) and Harry Murray.


Because he had put in two hitched with the regular army before war was declared, Norm won his stripes in a hurry when called by the draft nine months ago.



A seaman second class in the coast guard, Cal visited his friends at "600" during his recent furlough.





Now, however, he's a sergeant and is stationed in Australia. Slung over his shoulder here is his gas mask and steel helmet.


Jack was commissioned a second lieutenant late last month when he graduated from an officers' candidate school in the South.

THREE is one thing every Surface Lines employe can do to back up the 875 former co-workers now serving in Uncle Sam's armed forces—join the Ten Per Cent Club of war bond buyers.

By investing at least 10% of each paycheck in war savings bonds, those participating help our country and help themselves.

Buying Bonds Helps Government

First, they give our Government and our armed forces the necessary support to win this war. Second, they are carrying through a systematic savings plan under which they are guaranteed utmost security and a good rate of interest.

Although the Surface Lines was a

Here's How to Join 10% Club

Here's how to join the patriotic Ten Per Cent Club:

1. Figure how much 10% of your pay totals.

2. Ask for a new payroll authorization form.

3. Fill it out so that your new bond savings amount to 10% or more.

4. Return the new form along with your present authorization.

leader in the early days of war bond buying, we now are lagging behind most other groups. Before Pearl Harbor, we had an outstanding record for the percentage of employes buying bonds. But in the current campaign to have all Americans invest 10% or more of their pay in bonds, we have fallen behind.

While 1,087 Surface Lines employes already have earned individual memberships in the Ten Per Cent Club, the average bond buying of the nearly 15,000 others is decidedly below the 10% goal.





Word has just been received from Walter Hager, in the state of Washington, that he recently received his stripes as a sergeant. Congratulations, Walt!


Another recent visitor, Andy Barr, formerly of the Armature Room, West Shops, who is serving in the merchant marine, told us many interesting stories about his branch of service.

RANKED BY the percentage of their number who are investing 10% or more of their wages in war bonds through our payroll savings plan are the 25 chief groups of employees.


Numbers following the names of those six groups which showed progress last month indicate the number of steps toward ringing the bell each climbed.
