
### UNUSUAL OCCURRENCE REPORT FOR MONDAY, NOVEMBER 2, 1942


#### UNUSUAL OCCURRENCE REPORT FOR SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 7, 1942



### UNUSUAL OCCURRENCE REPORT FOR WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 18, 1942

At 8:12A. M., Ex. 163 north, cars 163-733-197-183-728-722, Motorman M. A. Miller, Conductor E. Morrill, Collectors L. Votruba and J. D. Greendyk at a point about five hundred feet south of Montrose Tower, Chicago, Illinois, in a very dense fog, collided with rear end of standing C.R.T. Co. train.
