At 5:38 P.M. Train No. 651, cars 154-718-734-716, Motorman M. Roberts, Conductor Jacobs, Collectors Hobson, Witzke and Rine, at Linden Avenue, Wilmette, collided with westbound 1938 Oldsmobile Sedan, license number and name of driver not obtained as auto did not stop. Air hose cut and air pipes bent on car 154. Crossing protected by wigwag signal, working OK at time of accident. Auto traveling at high rate of speed, drove across track in front of train and motorman was unable to stop in time to avoid collision. Train instected at Highwood.
