QuikPass Demonstration Project

What It Is

Beginning March 1, the CTA will be testing the reliability and effectiveness of a kind of monthly riding pass that can be read and accepted electronically.

Eight test stations will each have two automatic turnstiles equipped with card reading units. During the ninemonth test period, up to 15,000 riders who purchase monthly passes at 16 designated pass sales locations will be able to enter the test stations through the orange automatic turnstiles, or use them as convenient flash passes at any other CTA rapid transit station or on any CTA or RTA bus. Customers who can use the experimental QuikPass feature will be able to avoid lines at the fare agent booths and "Pass On By".

The eight test stations are as follows:

Downtown

Adams/Wabash, Loop Elevated Randolph-Washington, Dearborn Subway Lake/Wells, Dearborn Subway Merchandise Mart, Ravenswood Branch Chicago/State, State Subway

Outlying

95th/State, Dan Ryan Branch Morse/Rogers Park, Howard Branch Jefferson Park, O'Hare Branch

How it Works

Special plastic pass cards incorporate both a hologram for visual verification and a magnetic strip. The strip is encoded with the month the pass is valid and the individual serial number of the pass.

Orange pass reader turnstiles at each test station are controlled by a single microprocessor, which keeps a file of serial numbers of all passes accepted at the station. Each incoming pass read is checked for the proper month, and its serial number is compared against the station's file of recently used passes, to guard against improper use by more than one person.

How to Participate

During the period of the test, March 1 through November 30, 1987, a limited number of magnetically coded monthly passes will be available for public purchase. One or more pass sales outlets in the service area of each test station will offer magnetic passes at the regular monthly pass rate, currently \$46.00.

Passengers who use one or more of the eight test stations and wish to participate in the magnetic pass reader test need only purchase coded passes.



QuikPass use

- 1) At any test station, go to a turnstile marked with **orange**.
- Hold the top edge of the card firmly between the thumb and index finger of the right hand. Note position of arrow on card.




Position card in the front end of the reader slot and apply a slight downward pressure.



 In one position, slide pass card through reader at a constant brisk pace.






If you have a problem

1) Note position of arrow; is it correct?



2) Slight upward positioning of card will cause a misread. Maintain slight downward pressure.







- 3) If you have a misread (card not accepted on first wipe thru reader), wait two (2) seconds before trying again.
- 4) Maintain a constant brisk pace when swiping card through reader. Reading is more reliable faster than slower.



5) Has your card been used for entrance within the last hour? The system is designed to only allow one ride per card within a time limit. Two persons cannot use one card!
