

The South Shore Line's train schedules give you convenient departure times throughout the day and evening to the heart of Chicago.



CTA offers convenient, frequent service by bus and elevated/subway trains to all major attractions—at very economical rates. No traffic, parking, or towing worries!



CTA also offers special programs such as Culture Bus Tours, elevated train tours, and Visitor Passes—plus a fast and reliable way to O'Hare Airport!

To make your trip into Chicago even more economical, the South Shore Line offers discounted multiple-ride tickets for both individuals and groups.

Regular Service and Fares

South Shore Line stations at Van Buren/Michigan and Randolph/Michigan are very convenient to CTA bus and train lines. Use the pedway to get to many bus and train routes!

You can get to all major attractions on ONE BUS OR TRAIN (see the "Quick Ride Guide" on the back). Service every few minutes all day and evening on most routes.

As you can see in the fare chart, tokens save you money compared to cash fares. Buy tokens at CTA rail stations and Chicago currency exchanges and most banks.

Exact fare is required on buses, but you may use dollar bills. A transfer allows two more rides within two hours, but not on the route you started on.



Visitors' Passes for Easy Riding

CTA offers unlimited-riding visitors' passes to groups of 25 or more. These make traveling by CTA even more convenient, as you never have to worry about exact change or transfers.

Passes are available for 1 day for \$2.00; 3 days for \$5.50; 4 days for \$7.00; and 7 days for \$12.00. They must be ordered 4 weeks in advance. A pass for individuals and families may be available in fall.

Culture Bus Sunday Tours

On Sundays and Holidays from May through September, CTA's Culture Bus takes you to over 30 Chicago museums, neighborhoods, and fun spots. Buses are air-conditioned, and there's a tour guide, too!

No reservations are needed. Buses begin on three routes from the Art Institute (Michigan/Adams) every few minutes from 10:30am to 5:00pm. Each tour takes about 1 1/2 hours.

One special ticket (\$2.50 adults/\$1.25 ages 7-11) gives you unlimited riding, discounts at certain attractions, and half fare on Chicago Motor Coach Company double-decker buses!




Elevated/Subway Train Tours

CTA offers guided tours on in-service elevated/ subway trains for groups of 25 or more. This is a great way to see the city and acquaint people with the 'L'. Explore the system's history, operation and architecture!

Tours are customized for the group, and can be done at any time except weekday rush hours. They usually run from 30 to 60 minutes. The only cost is the fare per person.

We also offer tour planning for groups that just want to take a train or bus ride, on any regular service or the Culture Bus. Call (312) 664-7200 x3013 weekdays 8:00am to 4:30pm.



Fast Track to O'Hare



Take the South Shore Line train to Randolph Street station. Walk thru the pedway to the Washington/Dearborn subway station. Then take CTA's O'Hare train to the Airport in just 39 minutes!

CTA trains run every 5 to 10 minutes all day and evening. Use the time to get work done...or watch traffic jams on the Kennedy Expressway.

No high parking fees, no \$25 cab rides....just \$1.25 to O'Hare! At the Airport, you are IN-SIDE, one block from all terminals by escalators, elevators, and moving sidewalks. Luggage carts are just beyond the station.
