THE GAME PLAN:

CTA offers fast, direct service to all sports events in Chicago. No worries about traffic, parking, or being towed.

THE OPTION PLAY:

Full fare for CTA trains and buses is \$1.50. A transfer costs \$.30. Reduced fares (\$.75, \$.15 transfers) are available for children ages 7-11, and (with RTA ID Card) seniors and riders with disabilities (RTA ID Cards take 3-4 weeks to obtain. Medicare card holders are eligible. Call 836-7000 for info). Fares can be paid with coins in CTA Rail stations and with bills and coins on CTA buses. Or you can take advantage of one of the options on the adjacent panel.

THE BEST TICKET:

CTA's new Transit Card. This rechargeable card stores value, then deducts full fares and transfers on CTA and Pace – and you can share it with up to 6 other riders at once!





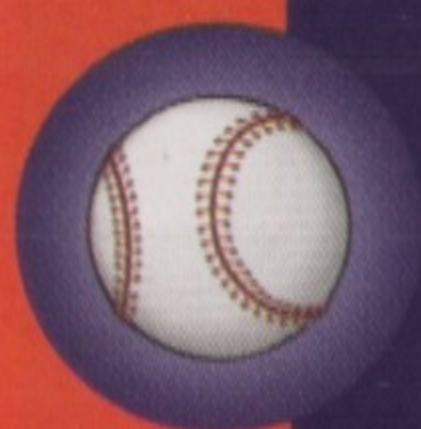
The #19 Stadium Express bus offers direct service from North Michigan Avenue and along Madison Street downtown (limited stops).

Easy connections can be made from CTA train lines and three Metra terminals – Randolph St., NorthWestern, and Union Stations.

Every 12 minutes starting 2 hours before the game...and buses wait for you after the game. Buses will make all stops along Michigan Avenue on the return trip.



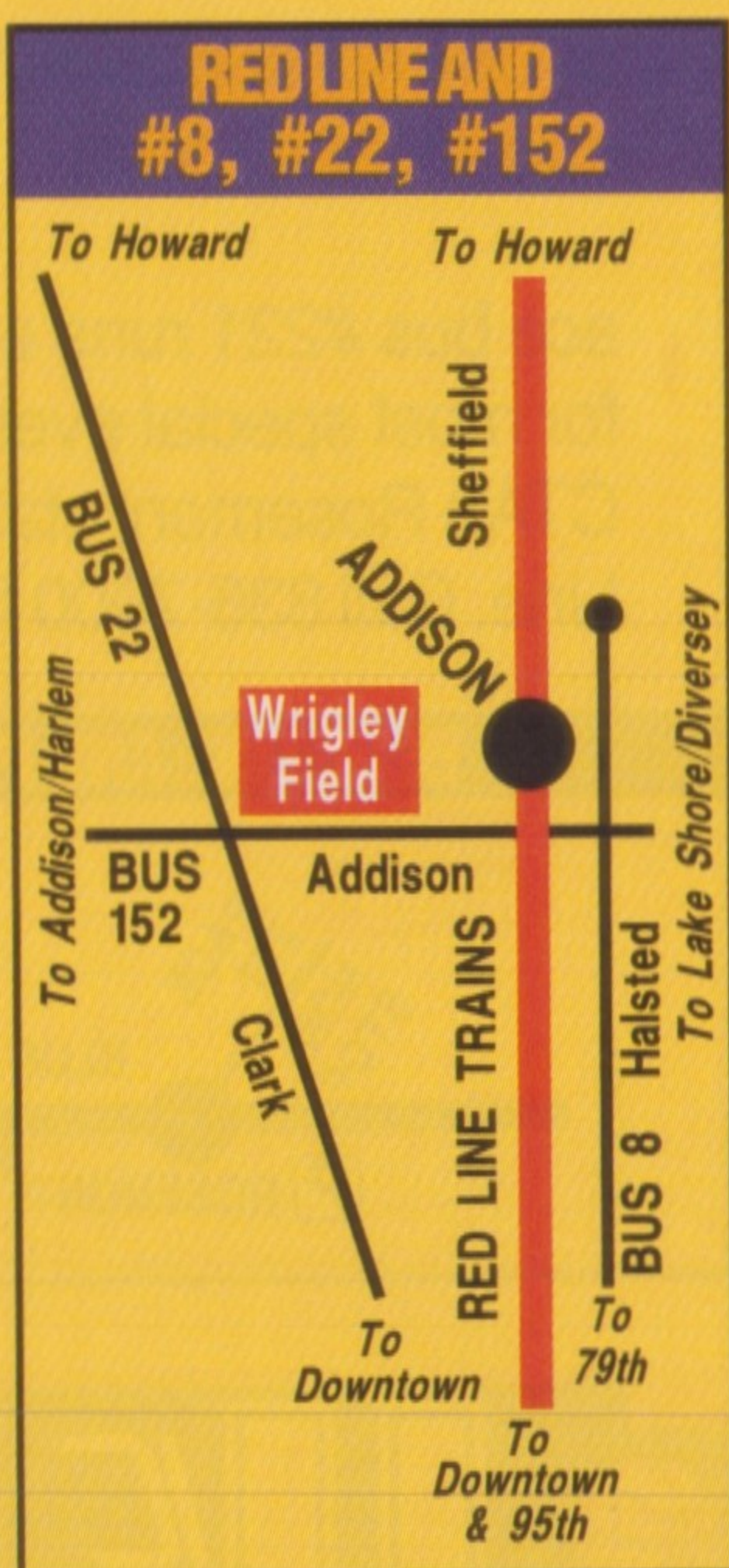
Additional bus service to all United Center events is offered by #20 Madison and #50 Damen.



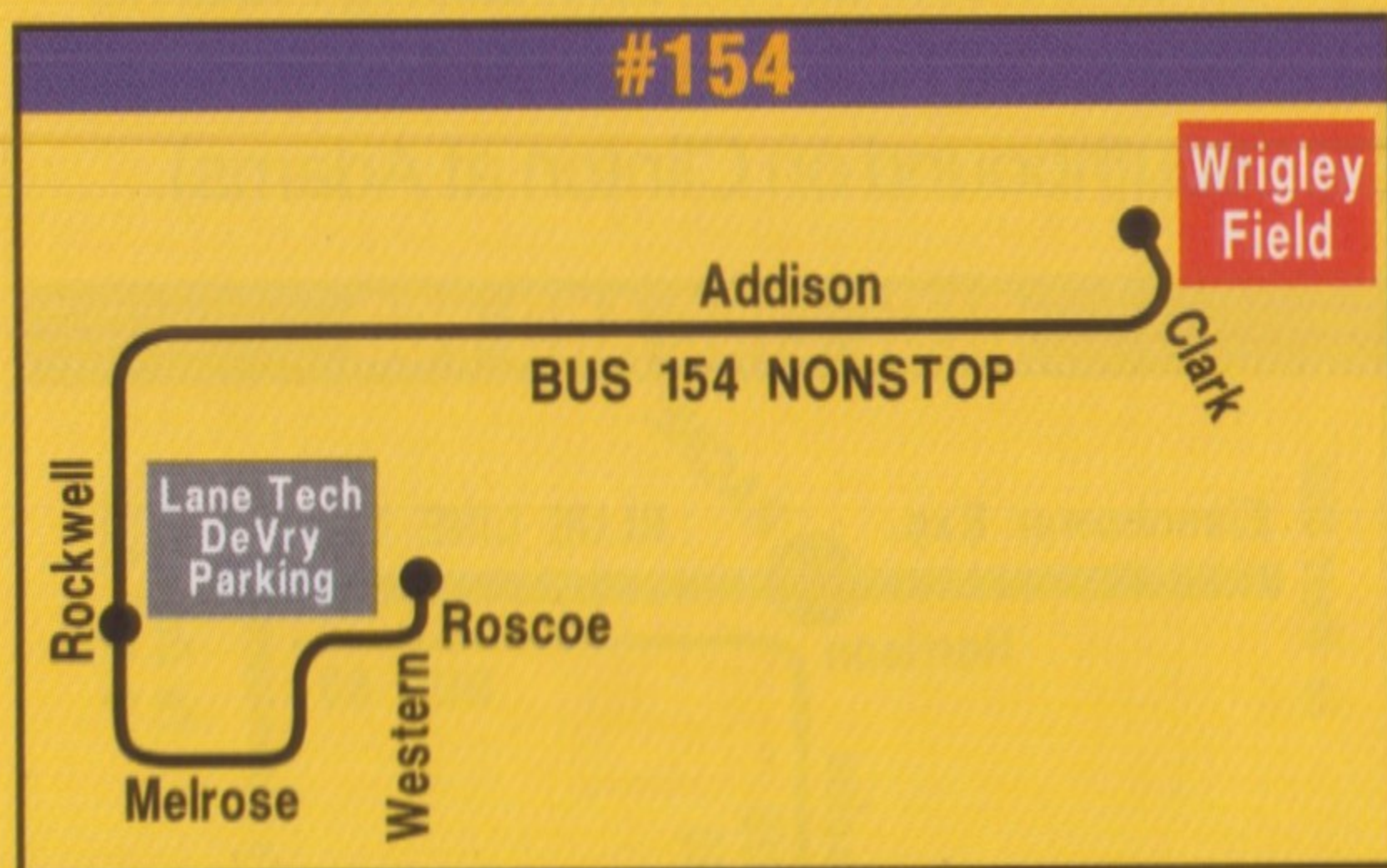
Cubs

Red Line trains go right to Wrigley Field (Addison Station). Board downtown in the State Street subway... free connections from all other CTA train lines.

Or take CTA buses #8 Halsted, #22 Clark or #152 Addison to any game – day or night!



For night games take #154 Wrigley Field Express bus from parking lots at Lane Tech or DeVry (Addison/Western). \$5 gets you parking and round-trip bus transit for a carload of fans. Starts 2½ hours before game.





SOX

The Red Line again! To Sox-35th station, right next to the ballpark.

Or ride Green Line trains to 35th-Bronzeville-IIT, then walk 2 blocks west.

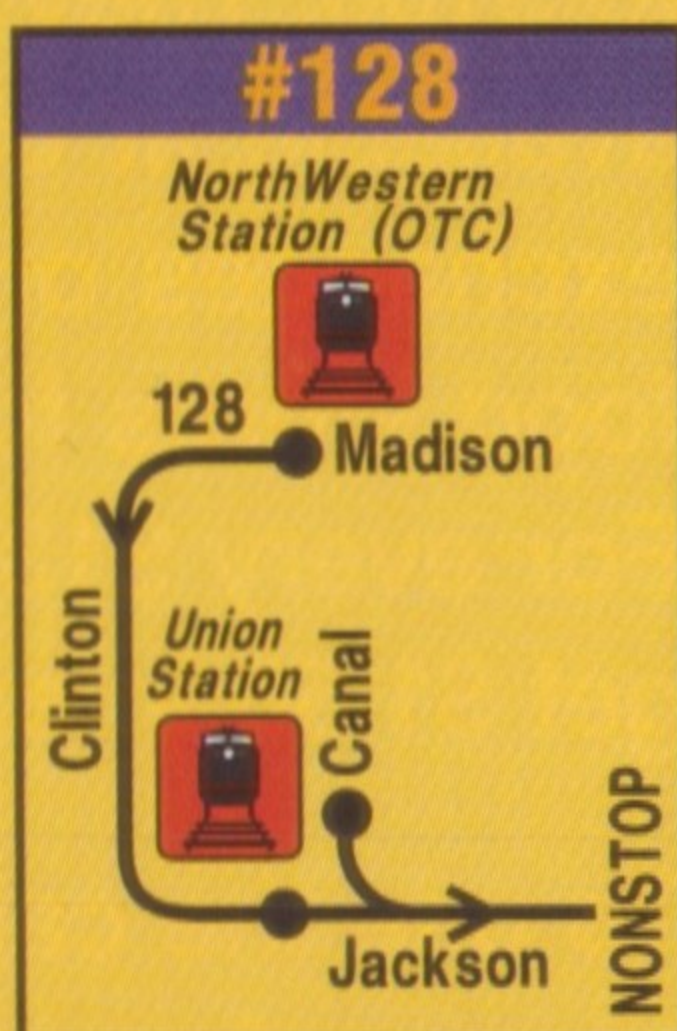
The #35 35th Street bus offers easy connections from the Orange Line, Archer Avenue and other routes.





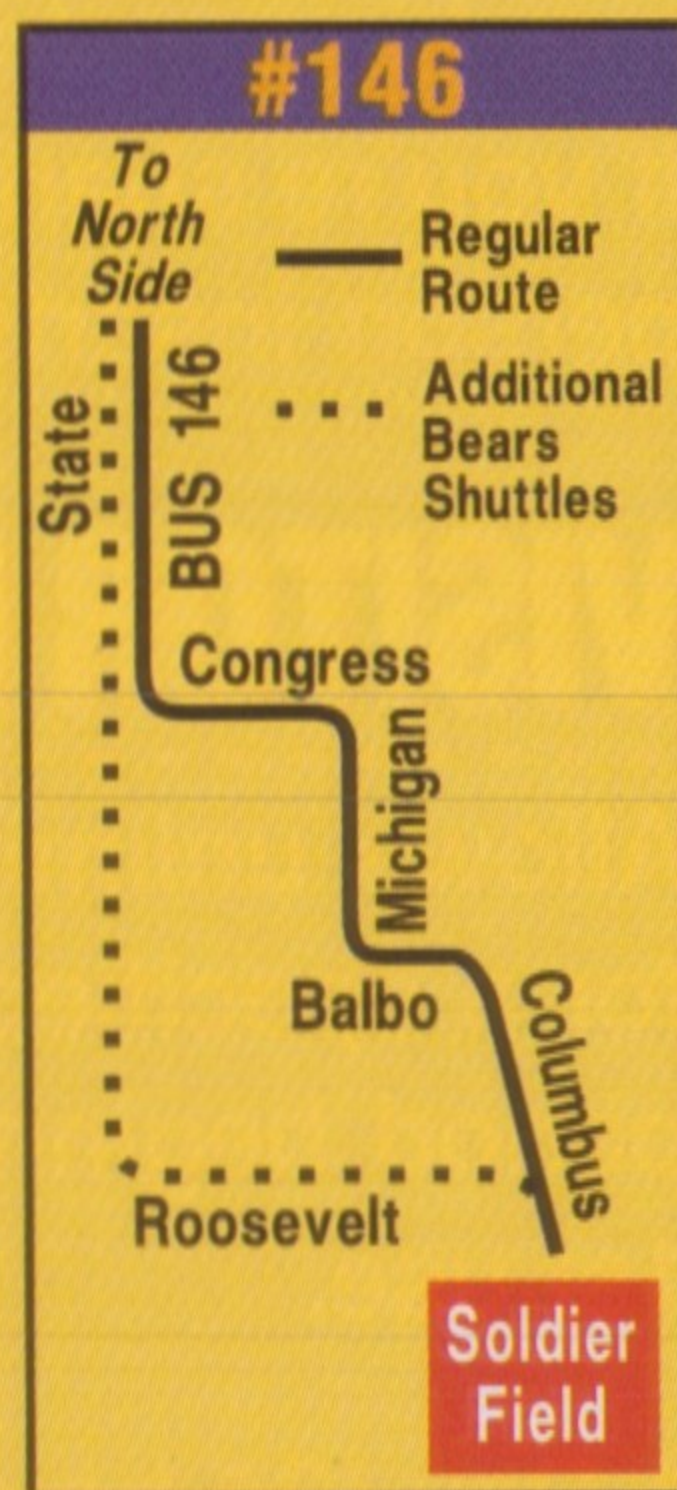
Bears

From NorthWestern and Union Stations, #128 Soldier Field Exp. runs *nonstop* – \$1 fare! At NorthWestern, board on Madison. At Union, board on Canal or Jackson. Starts 2 hours before game.



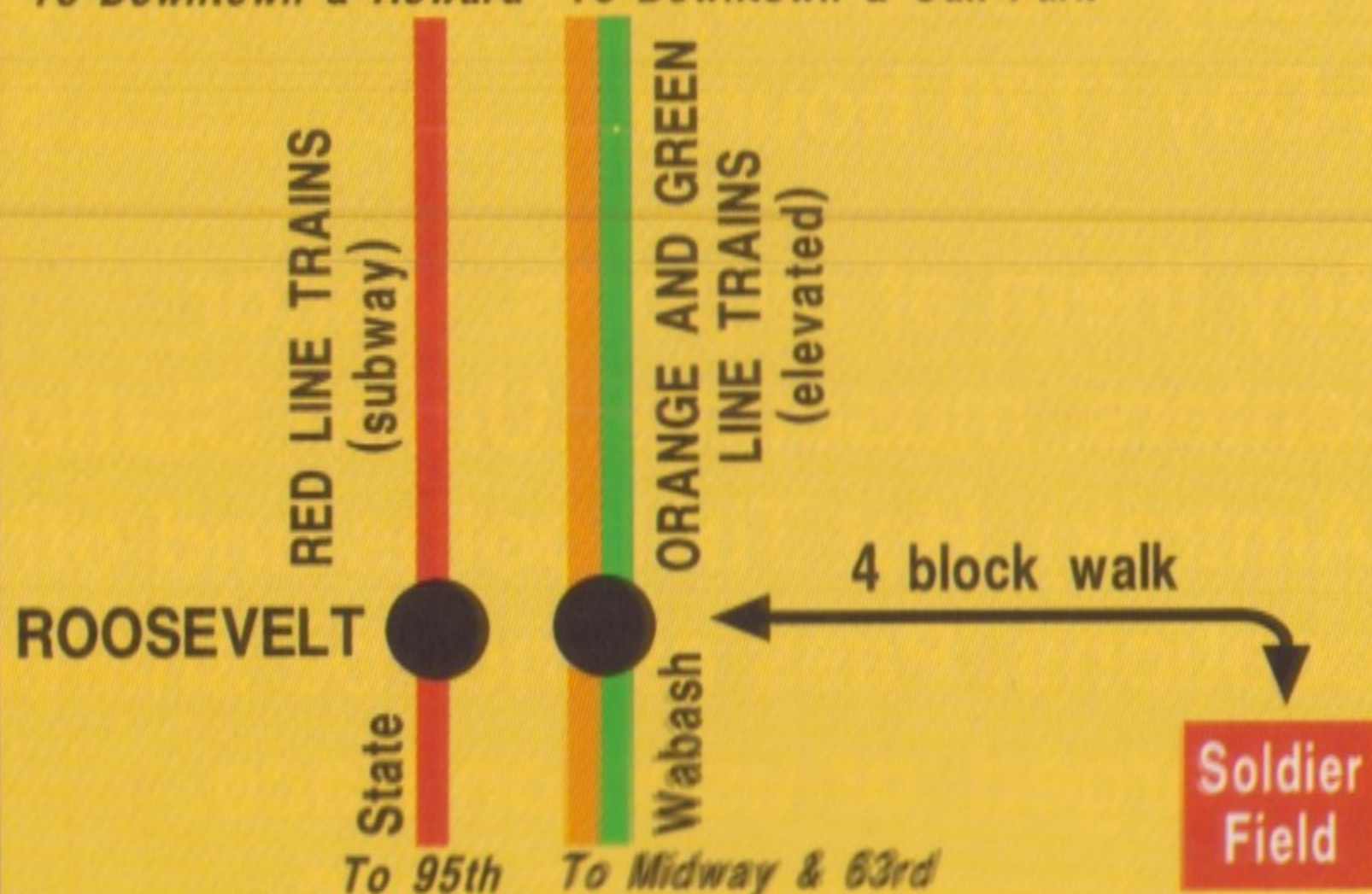
From the north side or downtown take #146 Marine-Michigan bus – plenty of extra service from State Street downtown!

Or, ride the Red, Orange or Green Lines to stations at Roosevelt and just walk east – you'll have plenty of company.

TRANSIT CARD:

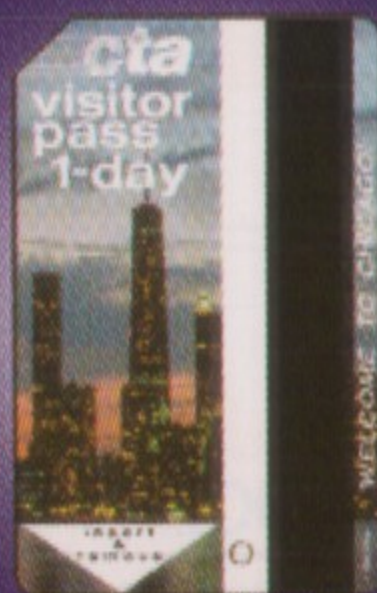
Buy them at any CTA train station from \$3 to \$100. They're also available at currency exchanges or Jewel or Dominick's food stores for \$13.50 or \$16.50. For every \$13.50 put on the card, get \$1.50 in extra value.



To use the card, just insert, then remove from any bus farecard machine or train station turnstile. If you're sharing the card, each person inserts it separately.

VISITOR PASSES:

Allows unlimited riding for a specified time period beginning with 1st use.



1-Day (24 hours)	\$5
2-Day (48 hours)	\$9
3-Day (72 hours)	\$12
5-Day (120 hours)	\$18

Buy them at airports, visitor centers, museums, Union Station (Amtrak), Hot Tix booths and other locations. Pass cannot be shared, recharged, or used on Pace.

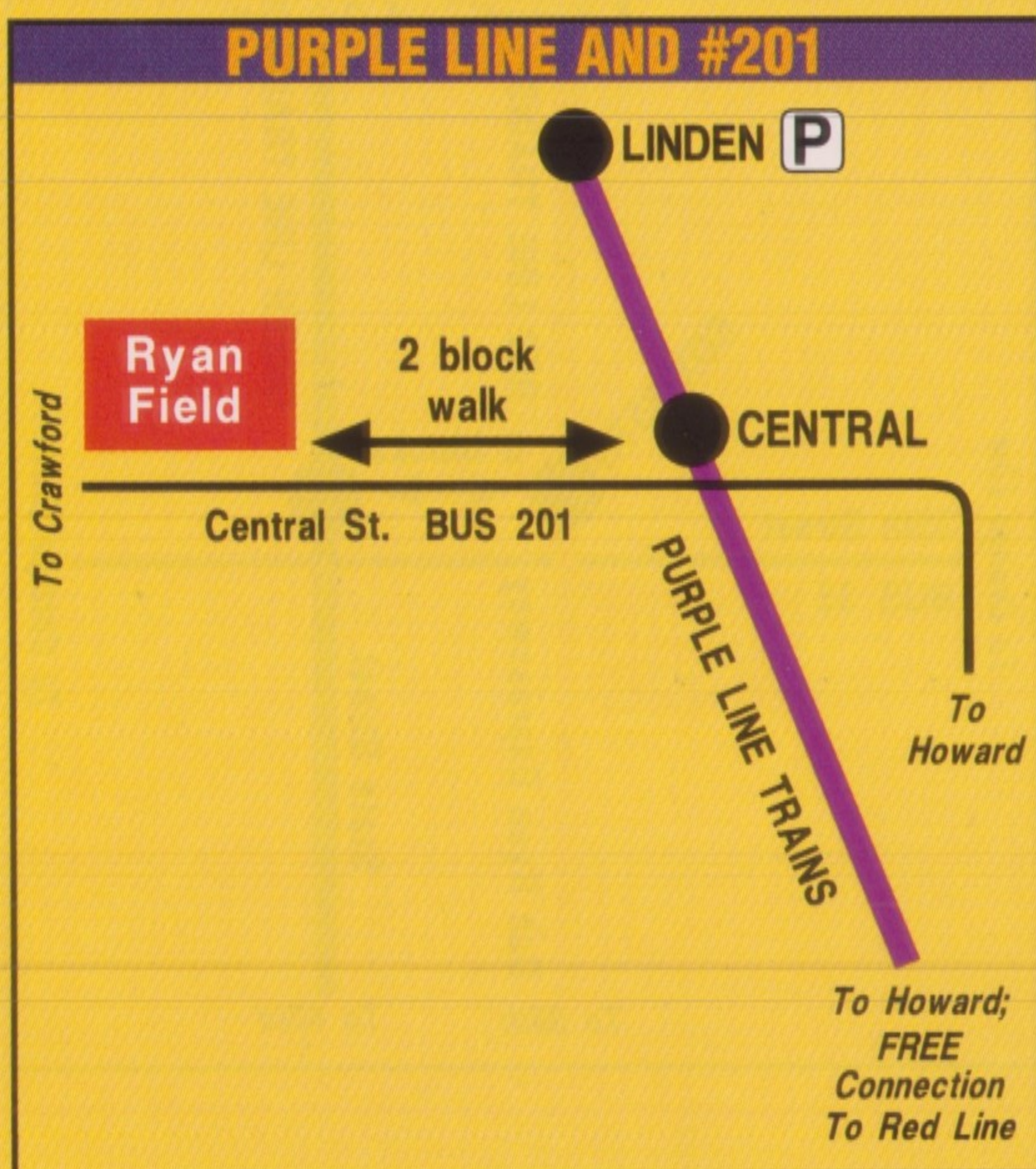


Wildcats

What better way than on Purple Line trains! Ride to Central Street, then a short walk west to Ryan Field. Trains make several stops in Evanston.

Free, same-platform connections at Howard Street from Red Line trains. Park at either Howard Street or Linden Avenue terminal, Wilmette.

Or take bus 201 Central/Sherman from Howard Street Terminal, which also travels through downtown Evanston.

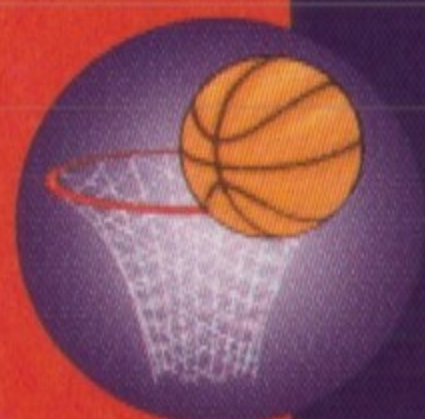
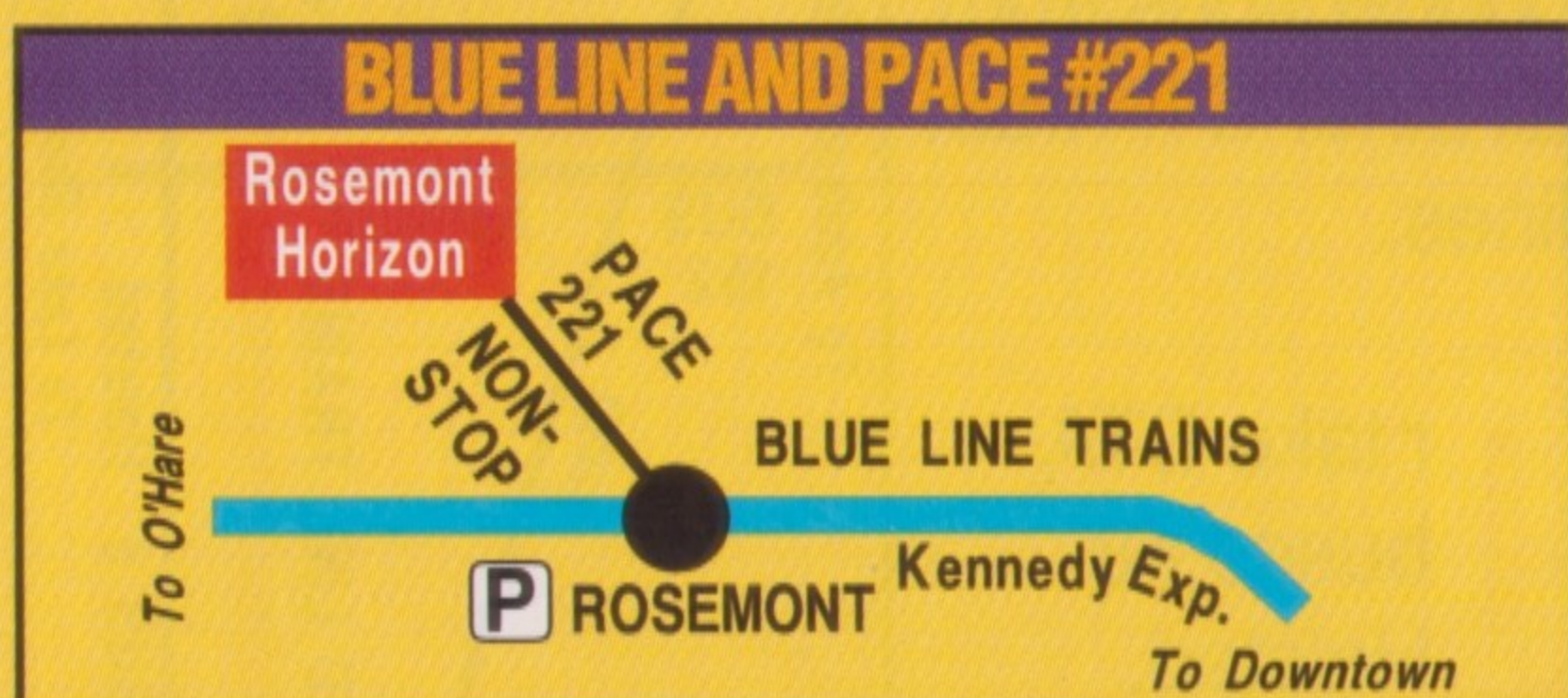




Rosemont Horizon

For DePaul basketball, Chicago Wolves hockey and more!

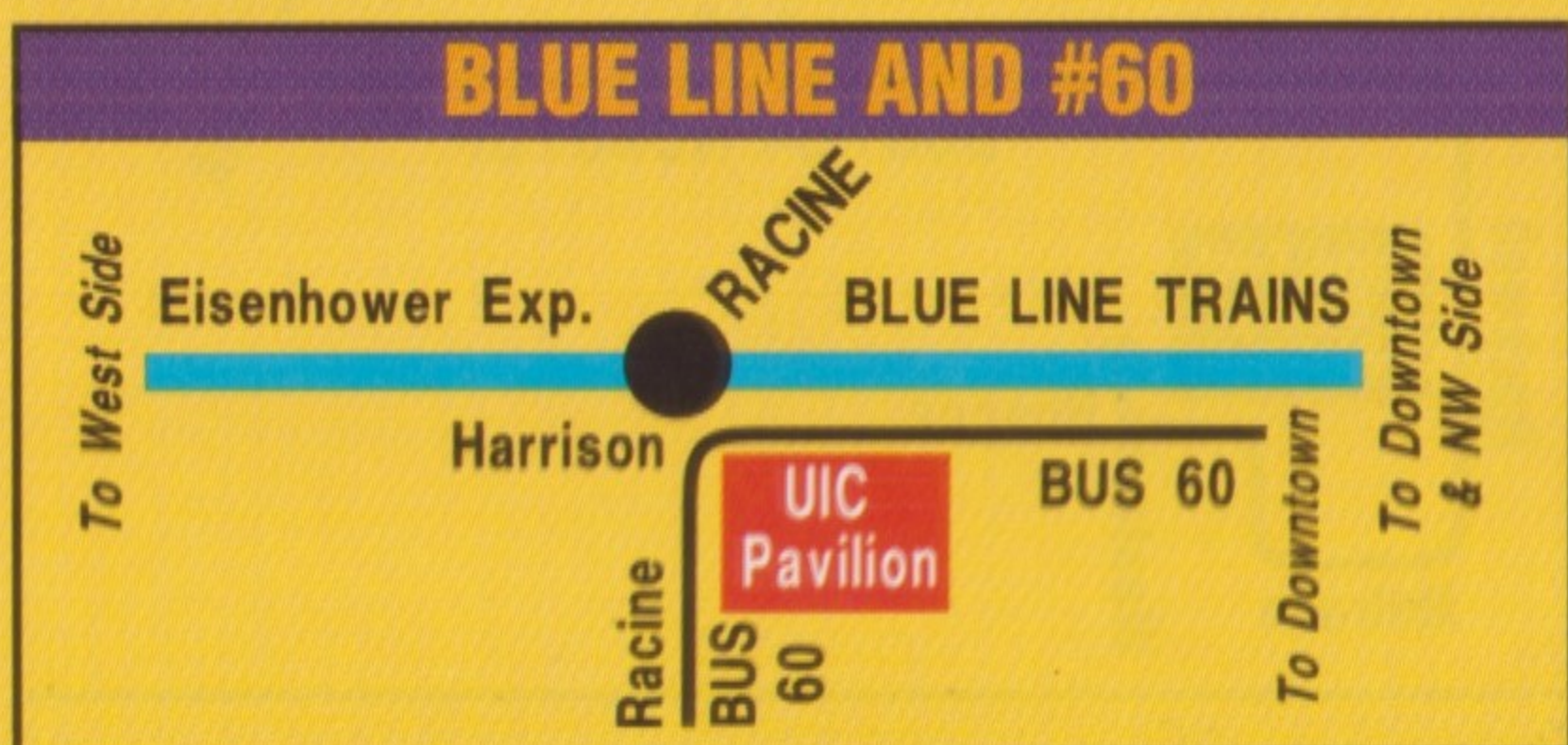
Pace bus #221 runs every 20 minutes for most special events, nonstop from CTA's Rosemont station on the Blue Line. Call 836-7000 for bus schedules.



UIC Pavilion

For UIC Men's and Women's basketball and concerts, too!

Take the Blue Line. Or take bus #60 Blue Island from downtown along Adams Street, or from Union Station (board southbound on Clinton at Adams).

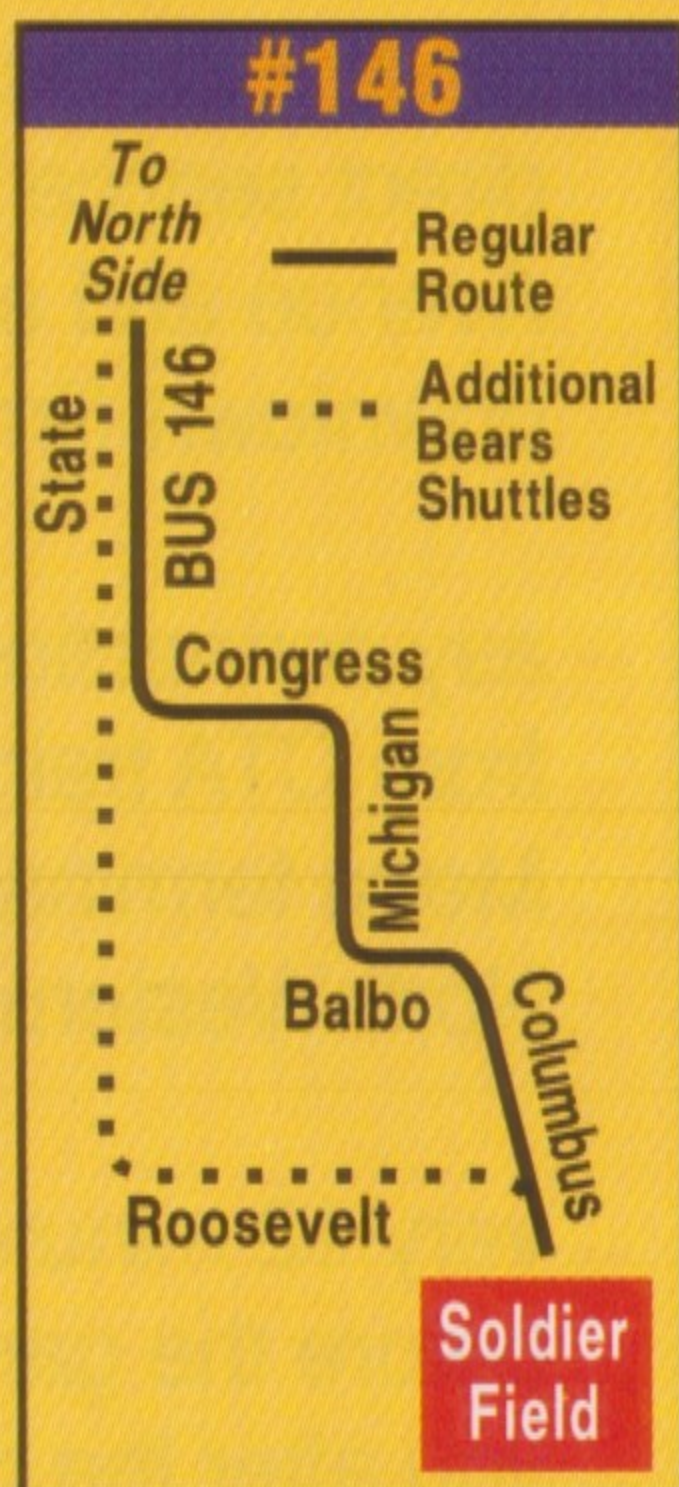




Fire

For Chicago Fire soccer at Soldier Field, from the North Side or downtown, ride the #146 Marine-Michigan bus from State Street out to the game.

Or you can ride the Red, Orange or Green Lines to stations at Roosevelt and use your feet to walk east through the Museum Campus



From the West Side or the stations you can ride the #12 Roosevelt bus right to the field!
