Riding The Train

Routing

Orange Line trains run between Midway Airport, the city's Southwest Side, and downtown Chicago.

In the downtown area, trains run clockwise on the Loop Elevated, above Van Buren, Wells, Lake, and Wabash.

Schedules

Trains run frequently:

- every 6 to 8 minutes in weekday rush hours.
- every 10 to 12 minutes most other times.
- every 15 minutes late evenings and weekends.

It's about a 30-minute trip from Midway to Downtown.

Trains make all stops, except on Sundays and Holidays, when three downtown stations are closed - LaSalle/Van Buren, Washington/Wells, and Madison/Wabash.

A timetable is available at Orange Line stations or by calling 836-7000, from any city or suburban area code.

When Orange Line trains are not running, use the #62 Archer bus between downtown (board south on State Street) and the Southwest Side.

Station and Train Signage

At the stations, platform signs that are overhead and on the columns tell you which way the trains are going.




Spaces at all stations are numbered. Pay by putting coins or dollar bills into the numbered slot boxes near the parking lot or the station entrance. Overnight parking is not permitted.

Bus Connections



At Midway Airport

The station is just east of the airport, across Cicero Avenue. A skybridge with escalators, elevators, and moving sidewalks connects the station with the airport. It's about a 5 to 10-minute walk. From the airport, follow these overhead signs:

Accessibility &


All Orange Line stations between Midway and Roosevelt are accessible with an elevator.

In downtown, State/Van Buren, Washington/Wells and Clark/Lake stations have elevators.

All trains are accessible. At one end of each car, a seat can be folded up so a wheelchair or other mobility device can be secured.

Security

The CTA has a strong commitment to customer security. We work closely with the Chicago Police Department's Mass Transit Unit, as well as with our own security forces, to maintain a safe environment. If you need to communicate directly with CTA personnel:




On the train,

there is a two-way communication system located near one doorway of each car, next to a blue

sign. This system allows you to communicate with the train operator immediately. Push the button to talk.

At the station,

Customer Assistant Call Buttons are located near the turnstiles and on the platform. Push the button to call for assistance at your location.



Paying Your Fare

Transit Cards

Full fare cards are available from vending machines at CTA rail stations, select Dominick's food stores, Navy Pier and Northwestern University Hospital. Get reduced fare cards (restrictions apply) at Currency Exchanges, Jewel and Dominick's food stores, and CTA's Web site: www.transitchicago.com.

Both rechargeable cards deduct fares and transfers on CTA and Pace suburban buses.

To Buy a Full Fare Card

Put in the exact amount you want, \$1.50 to \$91. (For every \$10.00 put in, you get \$1.00 of extra value). Press vend. The card will come out on the lower right-hand side of the Transit Card vending machine.



To Use a Card or Pass

Insert and remove it from turnstile or bus farecard machine. Up to 7 full fare riders can share the card (insert separately). Recharge the card for as little as 5¢ at any Transit Card vending machine.

Cash Fares

\$1.50 for full fare riders and 75¢ for reduced fare riders (children 7-11, elementary & high school students, seniors & riders with disabilities with CTA/RTA Permit). When you pay your cash fare in the turnstile, you can buy a **transfer card** for two more rides in two hours on CTA or Pace (30¢ full fare and 15¢ reduced fare).


Reduced fare riders must see the station Customer Assistant for cash or Transit Card entry.

Transferring Between Trains


Connections between CTA trains are free. However, to connect between the Orange Line and Red Line subway trains at State/Lake, you must use a Transit Card, Pass or Permit – when you are leaving one station and entering another. No transfer charge or use will be deducted when changing trains.

Passes (For Visitor Passes See Back Cover)

Unlimited rides on CTA and Pace (1-Day Fun Pass and 7-Day Pass valid only on CTA). Available at Currency Exchanges, Jewel and Dominick's food stores, and CTA's Web site: www.transitchicago.com.

Unlimited rides on any CTA bus or train:

1-day/\$5 2-day/\$9 3-day/\$12 5-day/\$18

Buy your pass the day you need it, or in advance — the card is not activated until your first use. To activate, just insert and remove in any CTA bus farecard machine or train station turnstile. The card cannot be shared or recharged.
