CTA buses and trains operate frequently, 7 days a week, to Chicago's top tourist, shopping, recreation and entertainment destinations.


Whether you're planning a conference or family reunion, visiting Chicago with friends or by yourself, the CTA is at your service.

An Unbeatable Travel Value

CTA Visitor Passes allow unlimited riding on CTA buses and trains. Avoid the expense of parking and cab fares. Leave traffic hassles behind with a 1-, 2-, 3- or 5-Day Visitor Pass.

Purchase Visitor Passes at any of several retail outlets throughout Chicago. Visitor Passes are available at museums, Visitor Information Centers, Hot Tix booths, the Sears Tower and several hotels. See inside for a complete list of locations or call 1-888-YOUR-CTA for the location nearest your hotel.


For multiple rides on CTA, Visitor Passes are a great option for children, too! The regular cash fare for children ages 7-11 is 85¢ (\$1.00 with a transfer). Children under seven ride free with a fare-paying adult.



Order Online

For added convenience, order Visitor Passes online. Just go to www.transitchicago.com and click on the "Transit Cards/Passes" page. Order today and you'll receive your Visitor Passes within 10 business days. All major credit cards are accepted. All sales are final.

Your pass activates the first time you use it. Just dip your pass with the magnetic stripe facing you, and the arrow facing down into the bus farecard machine or the train station turnstile – and go! The pass is good for the number of consecutive days shown on the front of the card.



Planes to Trains

CTA trains provide frequent and convenient service connecting both Midway and O'Hare Airports to Chicago's downtown Loop.

O'Hare Airport to downtown Loop in 40-45 minutes

The CTA O'Hare station is centrally located in the airport between Terminals 2 and 3. Follow the overhead Trains to City signs from every terminal.

Once in the station, follow the lighted signs to the Blue Line's Next Train Out. The downtown Loop Blue Line stations are Clark/Lake, Washington, Monroe, Jackson and LaSalle. Transfers may be made free of charge to other CTA rail routes at designated transfer stations in the downtown Loop.

Midway Airport to downtown Loop in 30-35 minutes

The CTA Midway station is located east of the main airport parking garage. Follow the overhead Trains to City signs from the terminal, through the parking garage, to the station.

Once in the station, follow the lighted signs to the Orange Line's Next Train Out. The downtown Loop Orange Line stations are Library-State/Van Buren, LaSalle/Van Buren, Quincy, Washington/Wells, Clark/Lake, State/Lake, Randolph/Wabash, Madison/ Wabash and Adams/Wabash. Transfers may be made free of charge to other CTA rail routes at designated transfer stations.


