



## All Aboard

This guide will show you how to see Chicago using CTA in the downtown and North Michigan Avenue areas, and a few places beyond.

The Chicago Transit Authority (CTA) runs buses and elevated/subway trains (the 'L') in the city and nearby suburbs. From downtown, you can get to most attractions on just one bus or train.




### Buses

#### **RIDING CTA BUSES**

CTA buses stop about every 2 blocks at signs that look like this. Signs list the route number, name and destinations, but not the direction of travel.

When a bus approaches, look at the sign above the windshield. It will first show the route number and route name, then "flip" to show the destination. If it's the bus you want, flag it down.





When paying your fare, remember that dollar bills go into the center slot of the farebox and coins into the slot on the left. All cards and passes are inserted into the slot on the right of the farebox.



#### **HOW THEY OPERATE**

Bus routes shown operate every day, including all holidays, unless the route number is in parentheses, such as (10).

Buses operate every 10 to 15 minutes, except for route (10), which operates every 20 to 30 minutes at certain times.

Routes that operate every day do so from early morning until at least midnight, with a few exceptions:

65 Grand: until 7:00 p.m. daily

146 Marine-Michigan Express: until 9:20 p.m. daily from Museum Campus; midnight from downtown

Routes that do not operate every day have service as follows:

(10) Museum of Science & Industry: weekends and holidays year-round; daily Memorial Day to Labor Day and Thanksgiving to New Year's Day, 9:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.

(124) Navy Pier Express: Memorial Day through Labor Day, Fridays from 6:30 p.m. to midnight, Saturdays 10:00 a.m. to midnight, Sundays/holidays 10:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

(130) Grant Park Treasures: Mid-May through Labor Day, weekends and holidays, from 9:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

(157) Streeterville: weekdays 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

#### ACCESSIBILITY &

All bus routes shown in this brochure are accessible except the #145 Wilson/Michigan Express and the #146 Marine/Michigan Express.



#### **RIDING CTA TRAINS**

Each train line has a different color name. All trains operate downtown daily, every 5 to 15 minutes until at least midnight, except the Purple Line Express (see map for hours). Here's a quick guide to boarding in the downtown area:

	RED LINE	State Street subway
4	BLUE LINE	Dearborn Street subway
4	<b>GREEN LINE</b>	Loop elevated (along Wabash & Lake streets)
	ORANGE LINE	Loop elevated
	BROWN LINE	Loop elevated
(H)	PURPLE LINE	Loop elevated

#### AT THE STATION

There are always Customer Assistants or Security Guards at stations to help you.

#### ACCESSIBILITY



More than one-third of our stations are accessible. For more information, call 836-7000 from any local area code.

#### **TAKING A RIDE**

Entering the Station – Signs list train routes and destinations.

#### **Blue Line Trains**

O'Hare-Forest Park-54/Cermak

On the Platform – Signs overhead and on the columns tell you which trains stop there, their directions, and destinations.


On the Train – Rail maps are above the doorways. Stops and connections are announced. Watch and listen for your stop.

#### TRAINS TO PLANES

Take the Blue Line between O'Hare and downtown. From the airport, follow the "Trains to City" signs. From downtown, board in the Dearborn Street subway; 45 minute trip.

Take the Orange Line between Midway and downtown.

From the airport, follow the "Trains to City" signs. From downtown, board at any elevated Loop station; 35 minute trip.



# Fares

#### **VISITOR PASSES**

Our 1-Day (\$5) pass offers 24 hours of unlimited CTA riding from the first use. This pass cannot be shared or recharged. Not valid on Pace. You can also buy 2-Day (\$9), 3-Day (\$12) and 5-Day (\$18) passes.



For advance sales and sales locations, call 1-888-YOUR-CTA or visit CTA's website at www.transitchicago.com. Passes are sold at Visitor Information Centers, Sears Tower, Navy Pier, O'Hare and Midway airports, and the Rosemont and Cumberland CTA train stations.

#### **TRANSIT CARD**

Deducts full fares and transfers on CTA and Pace.

First ride .. \$1.50 2nd ride within 2 hours ..... 30¢ 3rd ride within 2 hours .....

The card can be shared by up to 7 full-fare customers at once (each inserts it separately). Buy it from vending machines at CTA train stations from \$1.50 to \$91.

Put in the exact amount you want, push **VEND**, and out comes your card! Get \$1 bonus for every \$10 purchase. Add value at train station farecard machines.

You can also buy pre-valued Transit Card

at Currency Exchanges, Jewel, Dominick's and select Cub Foods stores, or at www.transitchicago.com. Reduced Fare Transit Card packs are also available at these locations.

### 25¢ Insert Coins Here packs for \$10 (\$11 value) or \$20 (\$22 value)

#### CASH FARE

One ride is \$1.50 full fare and 75¢ reduced fare (ages 7-11). Seniors 65 and older, customers with disabilities, and Medicare card holders can apply for RTA reduced fares by calling 836-7000 from any local area code.

On buses, put the exact fare in coins or bills into the farebox. At train stations, one turnstile accepts the exact coin fare. The station Customer Assistant will help children through the turnstile.

When you pay your cash fare, you can buy a Transfer Card that allows 2 more rides within 2 hours on any route (full fare: 30¢; ages 7-11: 15¢). Free connections between CTA train lines at stations marked with a (no Transfer Card needed).
