

MONTHLY PASS Save over 30%. Good for unlimited travel between the fare zones indicated on the ticket during a calendar month. The pass is for the exclusive use of the purchaser and is not transferable.

**0-RIDE TICKET Occasional commuters or recreational** travelers save 15% off one-way fares. One 10-Ride can be shared by people riding together. Ticket is valid one year from date of purchase.

ONE WAY TICKET Good for one-way travel between the fare zones indicated on the ticket. Valid for one year from date of purchase.

WEEKEND PASS Offers unlimited rides on both Saturday and Sunday.

CE PLUSBUS Monthly pass holders can purchase a Pace PlusBus sticker for unlimited travel on all Pace suburban buses. Pace buses connect with Metra trains at many stations.

Monthly pass holders can purchase a Link-Up sticker for connecting travel on CTA and Pace buses. CTA usage is restricted to A.M. and P.M. weekday rush hours.

FAMILY FARES Allow up to three children under 12 to ride FREE with a fare-playing adult on weekends and holidays.

OUNG ADULT FARES On weekends and holidays, youngsters 12 to 17 years of age ride for half fare.

CHILDREN'S WEEKDAY FARES Allow children 6 and under to ride free when accompanied by a fare-paying adult (up to three children free per adult); children 7-11 save 50% over one-way fares.

NIOR CITIZEN/DISABILITY FARES Senior Citizens and customers with disabilities who have a RTA Reduced Fare Permit can purchase a reduced One-Way, 10-Ride or Monthly Pass.

CASH FARE Exact fare only.

RANSFER CARD Two more rides within two hours on CTA and Pace.

Deducts fares & transfers on CTA and Pace. Transfers must occur within two hours of first ride. Can pay for up to 7 full-fare rides at once. Add value at rail station farecard machines. Maximum card value is \$100. Buy full-fare cards at rail station farecard machines for any amount between \$1.75 and \$91. Get \$1 bonus for every \$10 purchase or added value.\*\*
