All Aboard!

This guide will show you how to use CTA to see downtown Chicago, North Michigan Avenue, and a few places beyond.

The Chicago Transit Authority (CTA) runs buses and elevated/subway trains (the 'L') in the city and nearby suburbs. From downtown, you can get to most attractions on just one bus or train.

Buses

Riding CTA Buses


CTA buses stop at bus shelters or signs that look like this. Signs list the route number, name and destinations, and in the downtown area, the direction of travel.


When a bus approaches, look at the sign above the windshield. It will first show the route number and route name, then change to show the destination. If it's the bus you want, flag it down.

First: 151 SHERIDAN Then: UNION STATION

When paying your fare, remember that dollar bills go into the center slot of the farebox and coins into the slot on the left side.

All cards and passes are inserted into the slot on the right of the farebox, except the Chicago Card, which must be tapped to the touchpad.





How They Operate

Bus routes shown on the map operate every day, including all holidays, unless the route number is in parentheses, such as (10).

Buses mentioned in this brochure run every 10 to 15 minutes, except for route (10), which operates every 20 to 30 minutes at certain times.

Routes that operate every day do so from early morning until at least midnight, with a few exceptions:

65 Grand & operates until 7:00 p.m. daily.

146 Marine/Michigan Express operates until 8:50 p.m. daily from Museum Campus; midnight daily from downtown.

Routes that do not operate every day have service as follows:

(10) Museum of Science & Industry & operates weekends and holidays year-round; daily Memorial Day to Labor Day and Thanksgiving to New Year's Day. Hours are from about 9:00 a.m., Monday through Saturday (9:30 a.m. Sundays/holidays) to 5:00 p.m. every 20 or 30 minutes. No service on Christmas Day.

(130) Grant Park Treasures & operates mid-May through Labor Day, weekends and holidays, from 9:20 a.m. Saturday (10:20 a.m. Sundays/holidays) to 6:00 p.m.

(157) Streeterville & operates weekdays 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Major Service Changes

The #124 Navy Pier & now runs daily between Union and Ogilvie stations and Navy Pier, 8:30 a.m. to midnight during summer (until 10:00 p.m. other times of the year). #56 Milwaukee & buses now end their eastbound trips at Madison/Michigan. Customers traveling to Navy Pier can transfer at Washington/State to #124 Navy Pier & buses.

Accessibility 🖪

Currently 90 percent of CTA's bus routes are accessible to customers with disabilities. All routes mentioned in this brochure are accessible except the #145 Wilson/Michigan Express and the #146 Marine/Michigan Express.

Trains

Riding CTA Trains

Each rail line is named for a color. All trains operate downtown daily until at least midnight, except the Purple Line Express (see map for hours). Trains run every 5 to 10 minutes during the day and early evening, and every 10 to 15 minutes in later evening. Here's a quick guide to boarding in the downtown area:

Red Line State Street subway

Blue Line Dearborn Street subway

Green Line Loop elevated (along Wabash & Lake streets)

Crange Line Loop elevated

Brown Line Loop elevated

Purple Line Loop elevated

At the Station

There are Customer Assistants or Security Guards at stations to help you.

Accessibility &

More than one-third of stations are accessible and every train has at least one car that is accessible to customers with disabilities. Taking a Ride

Entering the Station – Signs list train routes and destinations.

Trains to Planes 🖽

Take the Blue Line between O'Hare and downtown.

From the airport, follow the "Trains to City" signs. From downtown, board in the Dearborn Street subway; 45 minute trip.

Take the Orange Line between Midway and downtown.

From the airport, follow the "Trains to City" signs. From downtown, board at any Loop elevated station; 35 minute trip.

Fares

Visitor Passes

Our 1-Day (\$5) pass offers 24 hours of unlimited CTA riding from the first use. This pass cannot be shared or recharged. Not valid on Pace. You can also buy 2-Day (\$9), 3-Day (\$12) and 5-Day (\$18) passes.

Passes are sold at Visitor Information Centers, Sears Tower, Navy Pier, O'Hare and Midway airports, and the Rosemont and Cumberland CTA rail stations. For advance sales and other sales locations, call 1-888-YOUR-CTA or visit CTA's web site at www.transitchicago.com.



Transit Card or Chicago Card™

Deducts full fares and transfers on CTA and Pace.

First ride \$1.50 2nd ride within 2 hours 30¢ 3rd ride within 2 hours FREE

Cards can pay for up to seven full-fare rides at once. Add value at rail station farecard machines. Maximum card value is \$100.

Buy full-fare Transit Cards at Currency Exchanges, select Jewel, Dominick's and Cub Foods stores, and online for \$10 (\$11 value) or \$20 (\$22 value). Buy Chicago Cards online at www.transitchicago.com, or for a list of sales locations,

Cash Fare

One ride is \$1.50 full-fare and 75¢ reduced fare.

Reduced fares are for children ages 7-11; elementary and high school students with a CTA student riding permit; seniors 65 years and older; and customers with disabilities who have an RTA Reduced Fare Permit.

For more information, call 836-7000 from any local area code.

On buses, deposit the exact fare in coins or bills into the farebox. At train stations, one turnstile accepts the exact coin fare. The station Customer Assistant will help children through the turnstile.

When you pay your cash fare, you can buy a Transfer Card that allows two more rides within two hours on any route (full fare: 30¢; reduced fare: 15¢). Connections are free between CTA rail lines at stations marked with a • (no Transfer Card needed).
