



Riding The Train

Routing

Orange Line trains operate every day between Midway Airport, the city's Southwest Side, and downtown Chicago.

In the downtown area, trains operate clockwise on the Loop Elevated, above Van Buren, Wells, Lake, and Wabash.

First Train/Last Train

Trains operate frequently:

- every 5 to 10 minutes in weekday rush hours.
- every 10 minutes most other times.
- every 15 to 20 minutes early mornings and late evenings.


The trip from Midway to Downtown takes 30 to 35 minutes. Trains make all stops along the route.


A timetable is available at Orange Line stations or by calling 836-7000 from any local area code.

When Orange Line trains are not operating, use the #62 Archer bus between Downtown (board south on State Street) and the Southwest Side.

Signs and Announcements

At the stations, platform signs that are overhead and on the columns tell you which way the trains are going.


Bus Connections

You can connect to over 60 CTA and Pace buses from the Orange Line. Get a CTA Bus & Rail Map or Downtown Transit Sightseeing Guide from station Customer Assistants or by calling (312) 836-7000 from any local area code.

At Midway Airport

The station is connected to the Airport by a walkway, with escalators, elevators, and a moving sidewalk. It's about a 10-minute walk to the terminal. When you're coming **from** the airport, follow these overhead signs:

Accessibility &

All Orange Line stations between Midway and Roosevelt are accessible with an elevator.

In the Loop, Library-State/Van Buren, Washington/ Wells, and Clark/Lake stations have elevators.

Each train has a minimum of two accessible rail cars. At one end of each accessible rail car, a seat can be folded up so a wheelchair or other mobility device can be secured.

Security

The CTA has a strong commitment to customer security. In addition to uniformed and plainclothes police who patrol buses and trains, the CTA contracts with private companies including roving canine patrols. If you need to communicate directly with CTA personnel:

On each rail car, all CTA trains have a two-way intercom system in each car that allows customers to talk to the rail operator in an emergency.

When you need help or in case of an emergency, look for the blue light on the rail car lighting panel.

Push the operator call button to contact the rail operator.



If instructed, follow the yellow and red In Case of Emergency procedures posted at each passenger door exit of each car.

At each rail station, Customer Assistant call buttons are located near the turnstiles and on the platform. Push the button to call for assistance at your location.

Fare Information

Cash Fare

Exact fare only. Coins and bills accepted on buses only. Full fare: \$2.00; Reduced fare: \$1.00. Transfers are not available to customers paying with cash. Note: Cash is not accepted at rail station turnstiles.

Chicago Card®/ Chicago Card Plus_{TM}

Cards deduct full fares and transfers on CTA and Pace (except Pace route 835). Full fare: \$1.75 (bus and rail); 1st Transfer: 25¢, 2nd Transfer: Free. Transfers must occur within the first two hours of the first ride. Up to seven full-fare customers can share a card.

Buy Chicago Card and Chicago Card Plus online at www.transitchicago.com. For more information, call 1-888-YOUR-CTA (1-888-968-7282); TTY: 1-888-CTA-TTY1 (1-888-282-8891). Both cards receive a \$2 bonus for every \$20 purchase or added value. The \$5 purchase fee per card is waived through March 31, 2006.

Transit Cards

Cards deduct full and reduced fares, and transfers on CTA and Pace (except Pace route 835). Full fare: \$1.75 (bus), \$2.00 (rail); 1st Transfer: 25¢, 2nd Transfer: Free. Reduced fare: 85¢, (bus and rail); 1st Transfer: 15¢, 2nd Transfer: Free. Transfers must occur within the first two hours of the first ride. Up to seven full-fare customers can share a card.

Buy full-fare Transit Cards at CTA rail station Transit Card vending machines. Put in the amount you want on the card (\$1.75 to \$100). Pre-valued Transit Cards and Reduced Fare Transit Cards (restrictions apply) are available at Currency Exchanges, select Jewel, Dominick's and Cub Food stores, and CTA's web site at www.transitchicago.com.





Blue Line



Clark/Lake &—Go downstairs through the State of Illinois (Thompson) Center building to subway. Blue Line trains operate at all times between O'Hare, Downtown, and Forest Park. Service on the Cermak (Douglas) branch operates weekdays only, 4:37 a.m. to 1:22 a.m.

Brown Line



Library-State/Van Buren &— Walk downstairs and across mezzanine to the other platform. Brown Line trains leave Library station weekdays from 5:19 a.m. to 12:13 a.m.; Saturdays from 5:16 a.m. to 12:13 a.m.; and Sundays and holidays from 7:21 a.m. to 12:13 a.m.

Green Line



Roosevelt &—Stay on the same platform. Northbound Green Line trains operate weekdays from 4:17 a.m. to 1:22 a.m.; Saturdays from 6:16 a.m. to 1:21 a.m.; and Sundays and holidays from 7:16 a.m. to 1:21 a.m. Southbound Green Line trains operate weekdays from 4:37 a.m. to 1:27 a.m.; Saturdays from 6:28 a.m. to 1:27 a.m.; and Sundays and holidays from 7:28 a.m. to 1:29 a.m.


Purple Line



Library-State/Van Buren &—Stay on the same platform. Purple Line Express trains leave weekdays from 6:11 a.m. to 10:14 a.m. and from 3:43 p.m. to 7:15 p.m.

At other times, Purple Line trains operate only between Howard and Linden. To connect, take Red Line trains from Downtown, north to Howard.

Red Line




Roosevelt &—Walk downstairs to the station house at street level and proceed through the transfer tunnel to the Red Line subway.

OR

State/Lake — Walk downstairs to street level and then into Red Line Lake/State subway station entrance on State Street. Use your Transit Card, permit, or pass in the subway station turnstile. No transfer charge or ride will be deducted when transferring between trains.

Red Line trains operate at all times.

Yellow Line



State/Lake — Take Red Line north to Howard. Yellow Line operates between Howard and Skokie weekdays about 4:50 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. On weekends and holidays, take the #97 Skokie & bus between Howard and Skokie.

Visitor Passes

Unlimited rides on all CTA buses and trains:

Passes activate the first time they are used and are good for the number of consecutive days shown on the front of each pass. Passes cannot be shared or recharged.
