Monday, January 1, 1945, an extra train, for all passengers between Milwaukee and Chicago, will be operated from Milwaukee at 2:00 A.M., and will make limited stops between Milwaukee and North Chicago Junction, and express stops via the Shore Line between North Chicago Junction and Chicago. An extra train, for all passengers, will be operated from Milwaukee at 6:00 A.M., ahead of No. 90, and will make the same stops and schedule as No. 402. Train 304 will transfer Chicago passengers to this extra at Lake Bluff. An extra train, for all passengers, will be operated from Chicago at 3:00 A.M., and will operate via the Shore Line as an express train to North Chicago Junction, and as a limited train from North Chicago Junction to Milwaukee. Second No. 428, leaving Milwaukee at about 7:40 P.M. will accept Chicago passengers only at Milwaukee Terminal and will not stop for traffic between Milwaukee Terminal and Howard Street, unless otherwise directed.

Train No. 808, leaving Milwaukee at 7:50 P.M. will stop at Racine and Kenosha for Chicago passengers only, unless otherwise directed.
